

Salzburg College Internship Program

The Salzburg College Internship Programs are combined academic and applied learning programs. During the first block, students are required to take a German language course, "The European Experience" course and another academic course while participating in special internship preparatory meetings. During the second block, semester internship program students partake in a part-time internship alongside their third academic course whereas summer internship program students engage in a full-time internship. Prior German knowledge is not required. Salzburg College works closely with qualified students before their arrival and during their first weeks in Salzburg to select an internship placement best fitting each individual student's personal, language, and academic needs.

Internship Program Details

Internship students are expected to enroll in three academic courses as well as the internship for a total of 12 U.S. credit hours.

- The European Experience: History, Politics, Society and Culture
- German Language Instruction (all levels)
- Intercultural Communication OR Leadership Development
- International Internship (150-200 hours)

Room & Board

To maximize cultural engagement, students live either in Austrian families, breakfast and dinner incl. (Mon-Sun) OR share a room at an Austrian student residence, no meals provided.

Eligibility

Minimum GPA of 3.0 Sophomore standing

Application Deadlines

Fall: July 15 Spring: Nov. 15 Summer: March 15

Program Fee

The program fee includes tuition, accommodation, local excursions, study abroad fee, internship placement fee, Austrian health insurance and social events. The program fee does not include bus pass, individual expenses, passport, transatlantic transportation, international health & travel insurance, visa application fee, and other personal discretionary expenses.

Cancellation Policy

Cancellations made 1 month or more prior to the official start of a semester, will receive a 100% refund. Cancellations made within the month prior to the start of the respective semester will incur a 50% fee. Cancellations made after the start of the respective semester will incur a 100% fee. Official Semester Dates:

Fall Semester: 1 September-31 December Spring Semester: 1 January-30 April Summer Semester: 1 May-31 August
